Helping minority youth stay out of detention: Commissioners hold discussion on research, results and vision for the future

Cuyahoga County Commissioners Tim McCormack, Jimmy Dimora and Peter Lawson Jones today held a formal hearing aimed at reducing the number of youth who end up in a detention facility. The Commissioners keyed into the number of African-American youth who end up in detention and why. Representatives from local diversion programs reviewed programs currently in place to divert non-violent youths from confinement in the juvenile detention center. The Commissioners accepted a \$3.75 million grant to address the needs of the youth entering Juvenile Court in Cuyahoga County. The first years' funding of \$750,000 will allow the project to begin to study the current system, and recommend changes where warranted.

This discussion underscored the fact that recent research findings have proven that Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court sentences fewer minority youths to serve time than the national average. Racial bias does not show up in the Court's intake process. Dr. William Sabol of CWRU, a participant in today's panel, noted that his research learned that black and other minority youth are about twice as likely, though, to end up in the Juvenile Detention Center. Minority youth constitute about one third of the overall juvenile detention population. This contrasts with national and state data that show three out of four youths in secure detention are minorities.

The Juvenile Court grant accepted today has as one of its main objectives providing the ability to graduate young people up to a clinical treatment continuum, rather than criminal sanctions. In a recent article and subsequent editorial in the *Cleveland Plain Dealer*, Dr. Sabol's study noted that the County's goal to reduce minority confinement in the juvenile system can be achieved by diverting juveniles from court. This grant will specifically target that desired outcome – finding treatment alternatives to sentences imposed by juvenile judges.

Commissioner Tim McCormack stated, "We, as a community, have repeatedly been challenged over issues of equity of class and race in our youth and adult justice systems. What alternatives to detention does the County offer, and are we developing, to reach children before they get into more serious trouble? The fact is that the County has implemented many new programs to help youths avoid the dead end of serious offences and subsequent incarcerations. The people testifying to this fact here today show that this is an issue of vital importance to this county."

While the rate of confinement is still too high in Cuyahoga County, the Commissioners said the wide range of strategies and programs available locally to youth in the justice system are helping to address and reduce disproportionate minority confinement.

In addition, the roundtable participants heard a presentation on the Juvenile Justice Comprehensive strategy, a blueprint for dealing with troubled youth in the County. Commissioner Peter Lawson Jones commented, "If we are truly committed to ensuring productive futures for all of our youth, we must find an effective way to treat those with substance abuse problems and divert them from confinement. By also helping to reduce the number of African-Americans and Hispanic youth in juvenile detention centers, the grant can assist the County in meeting several important objectives."

The grant announced today is an important tool to assist in the implementation of the Comprehensive Strategy on Juvenile Justice. The grant-funded study and implementation of its recommendations will allow the county to serve juveniles' individual needs and address specific problems, rather than set youth on a course to certain incarceration. It will begin the process of changing the culture of juvenile justice in Cuyahoga County to treatment.

Related to this action is another grant application approved by the Commissioners today – a \$300,000 request to fund continuation of the Greater Cleveland Drug Court program. The adult Drug Court is designed to find treatment alternatives for individuals charged with drug offenses.

"The increase of drug courts throughout the country reflects the growing recognition by judges, prosecutors, and defense counsel that traditional criminal justice methods have not decreased drug use," said Commissioner Jimmy Dimora. "There must be some way to bridge the gap between the court and drug treatment services. This grant is important to Cuyahoga County's study and treatment of our juvenile offenders. Our community and public safety are better served by rehabilitation while at the same time accomplishing a very important task: helping to ease local court dockets that are collapsing under the weight of drug cases. This funding will be put to good use."
