MEMORANDUM

August 14, 2001
Agenda Actions

The regular meeting of the Board of Cuyahoga County Commissioners was called to order at 1:48 P.M. Commissioners Jane L. Campbell, Jimmy Dimora and Tim McCormack were in attendance.

The August 14th meeting resulted in the following actions:

- The first order of business was a presentation by Congressman Dennis Kucinich, Olmsted Township Trustees Tom Bush and Tim Hagan and a representative group of seniors who reside in Columbia Park, a mobile home park located in Olmsted Twp., for residents age 55 and over. An out-of-state company recently purchased the land and increased the monthly land rental fee and decreased services. The elected officials and seniors are seeking any assistance the County may provide in protecting their homes. The Board asked Thomas Brown, Assistant County Prosecutor, to review any and all options available and advise them accordingly.
- At this time, consideration moved to the regular order of the agenda and Items #1 – 2 were considered in order and adopted by unanimous vote.
- Item #3 was held at the request of the department.
- Item #4 was considered and adopted by unanimous vote.
- Item #5 was held pending department representation.
- Item #6 was read into the record, however, there were no recommendations offered for consideration.
- Items #7 – 19 were considered in order and adopted by unanimous vote.

- At this time, a motion to move into Executive Session to consider the appointment of a public employee was made and adopted by unanimous vote. However, before the Board left the Chambers, a representative of the County Recorder's office arrived for presentation of Item #5. The meeting was reconvened, Item #5 was considered and adopted by unanimous vote.
- At this time, a constituent, Sabrina Otis, requested an opportunity to address the Board relative to her concerns as the parent of five children trying to work with the Department of Children & Family Services to provide housing for her family. After assuring themselves that Ms. Otis had a place to stay and food for her children, the Board asked Deputy County Administrator Bette Meyer and Interim Director of the Department of Children & Family Services, James McCafferty, to work with Ms. Otis to resolve her immediate need of housing.
- At this time, a motion to move into Executive Session to consider the appointment of a public employee was made and the item was adopted by unanimous vote.
- Following Executive Session, and with no further business to be brought before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 5:33 P.M.
