# **AGENDA ACTIONS**

# February 23, 2006

The regular meeting of the Board of Cuyahoga County Commissioners was called to order at 10:27 a.m. Commissioners Jimmy Dimora, Timothy F. Hagan and Peter Lawson Jones were in attendance.

The February 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting resulted in the following actions:

# **INFRASTRUCTURE & DEVELOPMENT**

- 1. County Engineer, recommending to accept various projects as complete and in accordance with plans and specifications:
  - a) replacement of County Line Road Culvert No. 23 over a creek in the Village of Gates Mills.
  - b) replacement of Prospect Road Culvert No. 8 over a branch of Baker Creek in the City of Strongsville.
  - c) replacement of Sprague Road Culvert No. 16 over Strongsville Ditch in the City of Olmsted Falls.

Considered and adopted by unanimous vote.
