# 11:00 A.M. – CONTINUATION OF FINAL HEARING: Single County Ditch Petition for a proposed improvement in Olmsted Township

Commissioner Hagan recused himself from the hearing. Commissioner Jones opened the continuation of final hearing for a proposed improvement in Olmsted Township at 11:25 a.m. by recognizing Joyce Dodrill, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney, who presented to the Board the status of the soybean harvest and the soil mound removal. She referred to the County Engineer's report of April 19, 2007 indicating that Sharp Development had completed the ditch improvements and that the improvements have resolved drainage problems at Woodgate Farms. She also stated that Sharp Development had committed in a letter dated August 15, 2007 to remove the soil mound, but had been unable to do so before the continuation of the final hearing due to the existence of the soybean crop, which had not been harvested until December 7, 2007. Ms. Dodrill then recommended to the Board that it find that the improvements to the ditch were no longer necessary and that the Board set aside its former order entered on March 9, 2006 finding in favor of the County ditch improvement and dismiss the ditch petition filed on October 21, 2005, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 6131.21.

Commissioner Jones then asked for public comment and recognized Patricia Pribisko, legal counsel for Fleck Farms Ltd. and the McGuinness family, who addressed the Board and stated that she and her clients opposed the dismissal of the ditch petition and that remonstrances have not yet been withdrawn by the McGuinness family as Sharp Development and/or Forest City had not completed its required work on the McGuinness property.

Commissioner Jones asked the County Engineer to address the concerns posed by Ms. Pribisko. Brian Driscoll, representing the County Engineer, confirmed that Sharp Development had completed the improvements to the ditch and that all drainage issues concerning the Woodgate Farms subdivision had been resolved.

Commissioner Jones then asked if there was any additional public comment and, hearing none, moved that the Board find that the improvements to the ditch planned by the County Engineer are no longer necessary and that the Board, therefore, was compelled to set aside its former order entered on March 9, 2006 finding in favor of the County ditch improvement and dismiss the ditch petition filed on October 21, 2005, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 6131.21, which was considered and adopted by unanimous vote.

The final hearing was then closed at 11:49 a.m., without objection.
